AGENDA OF THE IQAC QUARTERLY MEETING- 18/08/2022

GURUKULA KANGRI DEEMED UNIVERSITY

Items on the Agenda

1. Welcoming all Core-Committee members

2. Discussing the Action Taken Report (ATR) of the Items presented in the Agenda of the last IQAC Quarterly Meeting. Certain changes have to be made to the composition of the IQAC, especially amongst the student members. This issue will be discussed concurrently with the ATR.

3. Seed Money and Creation of Inter-Disciplinary Research Groups

Details: Seed Money needs to be provided to newly recruited teachers so that they can carry out research in their respective fields of specialisation. Furthermore, there is a need for setting up Inter-Disciplinary Research Groups in order to promote and encourage inter-disciplinary research as mandated by NEP.

4. Incubation Centre

Details: There is a requirement of an Incubation Centre for promoting and supporting start-ups. Criteria 3 of the NAAC AQAR has a Key Indicator of Innovation Ecosystem worth 30 points, within which there is a separate matrice for Incubation Centre, which is on its own worth 10 points.

5. Criteria 3- AQAR

Details: The Criteria 3 of the NAAC AQAR focuses on Research, Innovation and Extension. This Criteria is worth 250 points out of which 15 points are allocated to Papers published. However there are 235 points left, which mainly focus on areas such as- NSS, NCC, extension activities, Incubation Centre, Seminars/Workshops, Research Promotion Policy, Seed Money, USIC etc. It would be in the interest of the University to look into this Criteria holistically instead of simply focussing on a few sub-criteria.

6. Awards/Incentives for Teachers

Details: Awards and incentives for teachers to conduct quality research and publish their research output in prestigious journals.

(7) Automation of Library

Details: The Library needs an automated system to issue and return books. There are several technologies which can reduce human interface in issuing and returning books which will in turn save lot of time of the library staff.

(8) Development of E-Content for MOOCs

Details: Criteria 3 of the NAAC AQAR focuses on development of E-Content for MOOC platforms such as SWAYAM, NPTEL, COURSERA, EDX etc. This Key Indicator is worth 10 points. Development of E-Content for the aforementioned platforms will help the University in achieving a high score in this Key Indicator.

(9) Open Online Courses for Students

Details: As per the NEP, students will have to pursue certain courses on MOOC platforms. Therefore, departments of the University will have to list out the relevant open online courses that students will study as part of the aforementioned requirement.

(10) Patents- Product Development and Marketing

Details: The University should focus on development of a product/service from a patent and thereafter the University can also support the marketing of the product/service. Such an effort will also help in generating finances for the University.

(11) Joint effort by PhD Scholars and Research Supervisors in Research Publications




























Furthermore, UGC has made it compulsory for PhD scholars to publish at least one paper during the course of their doctorate studies. Since the PhD supervisor plays an important role in furthering the scholars' research, joint publication of papers should be mandatory.

IQAC Quarterly Meeting

Minutes of the Meeting

Date- 18/08/2022

Meeting Chaired by: Hon. Vice Chancellor- Prof RoopKishore Shastri

Meeting began with chanting of Vedic Mantra

Agenda I: The Director IQAC, Prof RC Dubey took permission of the Chair to start the meeting. Prof Dubey welcomed two new members of the IQAC core committee, Ms Annapurna Kataria and Mr Shubham Choudhary, PhD students in the Botany & Microbiology Dept and Chemistry Dept. Thereafter Prof RC Dubey asked Deputy Director IQAC- Dr Varoon Bakshi to read the Action Taken Report (ATR) of the items on the agenda of the previous meeting. Dr Bakshi briefly explained the preparation of the university with regards to the upcoming NEP based undergraduate session. He further went on to explain the process of onboarding the university to the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). Prof VK Singh stated that there is an issue regarding the name of the university due to which the onboarding process is taking time. Dr Bakshi further stated that training programmes had to be conducted for the non-teaching staff of the university. The Assistant Registrar Mr Pandey stated that the training could not be organised due to lack of funds. However, the Hon. VC stated that a training programme should be organised in the month of September 2022. Dr Bakshi further apprised the members of the committee about the preparation of the activity calendar by various academic departments of the university. According to Dr Bakshi most of the departments have prepared and sent their activity calendars to the IQAC. Prof VK Singh stated that there should be a uniform format of the calendar for all the academic departments. Prof Namita Joshi stated that Prof Devendra Gupta had talked about the importance of an activity calendar on 16/05/22. Prof Gupta further said that a budget should be allotted to the departments in order to carry out various activities, under which prizes can be given to the participants. The Hon. VC stated that a provision should be made for funds to be allotted for carrying out activities in the depts. It was unanimously decided that a sum of Rs 3000/- should be allotted to each dept for carrying out activities within an academic year. Dr Bakshi also stated that the report submitted by the fact finding committee constituted to look into the performance of the university during the last NAAC grading cycle, was discussed in the last meeting and the IQAC had started the process of implementing the recommendations of the committee.

Agenda II: Seed Money and Creation of Inter-Disciplinary Research Groups

Prof VK Singh stated that a provision of 6 lakh Rupees had been made towards the grant of Seed Money to the faculty. He further stated that an additional 6 lakh Rupees had also been provisioned towards start-ups in the university. The Hon. VC stated that inter-disciplinary research should be conducted in the field of Vedic Studies. He gave an example of conducting joint research between Vedic Studies and Microbiology. Prof LP Purohit stated that proposal for doctoral research in the field of Vedic Physics had been submitted and was being evaluated. Everyone unanimously agreed that inter-disciplinary research should be encouraged in the university.

Agenda III: Incubation Centre

Prof Satyendra Rajput stated that efforts were being made to get the incubation centre approved by the MSME. Furthermore, ideas regarding the functioning of the centre were solicited from the members. Moreover, a building would be required to house the incubation centre. Perhaps the IIC and other similar bodies could be housed in the same building where the incubation centre will be set up.

Agenda IV: Criteria 3: AQAR

Prof RC Dubey stated that emphasis should be given to inter-disciplinary research. Dr Bakshi explained that under Criteria 3, books were worth 10 points, PhDs per teachers worth 15 points, Papers, E-Content worth 15 points etc. Criteria 3 in itself carried a lot of weightage within the AQAR and SSR. The Hon. VC opined that it was important for the university to improve its performance under this criterion. Therefore, the Hon. VC stated that the number of publications were to be increased. Prof RC Dubey concurred with the suggestion of the Hon. VC. Prof Dubey further stated that PhD scholars should write papers along with their supervisors and hence the papers published by the scholars should also contain the name of their supervisor. Furthermore, it was unanimously decided that before submitting a thesis, the scholar would have to submit a copy of the papers published during his/her PhD research, to the IQAC. The IQAC would then check whether the papers are in the UGC Care List. Only after the approval of the IQAC, the scholar would be able to submit the thesis. It was decided that a notification in this regard would be issued. Prof Dubey further opined that such steps would promote a research culture in the university.

Agenda V: Awards and Incentives for Teachers

The Hon. VC stated that awards should be given to teachers who have research potential. Teachers who have published 5 research papers/4 book chapters/4 patents would be considered for the award. Prof Dubey stated that a 'Shodh Ratna' award for teachers should be constituted. Such an award would take into consideration the publications published in a calendar year. Moreover, Prof Dubey stated that a similar award should also be constituted for research scholars.

Agenda VI: Automation of the Library

The NAAC peer team had pointed to the need of fully automating the library. The Central Library is semi-automated. However, the library in KGC Haridwar is not even semi-automated. Automating the library according to RFID was needed. Furthermore, the RFID system has to be implemented in KGC Dehradun. Therefore Prof Dinesh Chandra Shastri stated that efforts would be made to semi-automate the KGC Haridwar library.

Agenda VII: Development of E-Content


It was stated that Dr Suyash Bhardwaj is the nodal officer for the SWAYAM platform in Gurukula Kangri. However a committee is needed to oversee the design and development of e-content. Hence, it was decided that the Registrar will issue orders for the formation of setting up such a committee.

Agenda VIII: Open Online Courses for Students

Based on the recommendations of the NEP, the committee decided to direct the students to enrol in open online courses. According to the NEP, at least 20 percent of the syllabus must be studied through online courses.

Agenda IX: Patents, Product Development and Marketing

The university has developed some patents; however, they should be used to develop products and efforts should be made to market the products. Dr Satyendra Rajput stated that efforts should be made to commercialise patents and market them. Furthermore, MoUs should be signed with organisations to jointly create products from the patents. It was decided that a report should be prepared regarding this process. Furthermore, a more detailed discussion would take place on this topic in meeting on 20/08/22.
