- 3.4 The Programme shall have multiple exit option at the end of TWO/FOUR/SIX semesters (ONE, TWO or THREE academic years respectively) with the award of Certificate, Diploma and General Degree.
- 3.5 The candidate availing exit option shall re-enter the programme at the beginning of any academic year to complete the degree with the prevailing syllabi.
- 3.6 All candidates shall be awarded Bachelor's degree with Honours on successful completion of EIGHT semesters (FOUR academic years) undergraduate programme.
- 3.7 A student will be allowed to enter/re-enter only at the odd semester and can only exit after the even semester. Re-entry at various levels as lateral entrants in academic programmes should be based on the earned credits and proficiency test records.
- 3.8 The validity of credits earned will be to a maximum period of seven years or as specified by the ABC. The procedure for depositing credits earned, its shelf life, redemption of credits, would be as per UGC (Establishment and Operationalization of Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) scheme in Higher Education) Regulations, 2021.
- 4. Progressive Certificate, Diploma, Bachelor Degree or Bachelor Degree with Honours provided at the end of each year of Exit of the Four Years Undergraduate Programme

## SCHEME OF EXAMINATION / ASSESSMENT

- 1. The evaluation of each course shall contain two parts:
  - Part-A: Internal or In Semester Assessment (ISA) and
  - Part-B: External or End-Semester Assessment (ESA).
- 2. There will be University Examinations at the end of each semester for both Theory and Practical.
- 3. For End Semester Examinations (ESE) all theory papers shall be got set/prepared by the Controller of Examinations as per approved norms and the evaluation of all theory papers shall be done by eligible teachers under the supervision and coordination of the Controller of Examination.
- 4. 40% of the marks allotted to each theory paper and practical paper including field work/project work/ dissertation, wherever prescribed, shall be reserved for internal assessment.
- 5. The internal marks awarded for the test to the students in each course in a semester shall be

- put on the notice board at least one week before the commencement of end semester examination (ESE).
- 6. The responsibility of the internal assessment is vested on the teacher(s) who teaches the course and in his/her absence it will be the responsibility of Head of the concerned department to get it done either by oneself or assign to other teacher.

7. A student shall be evaluated and record thereof maintained in accordance with the Regulations prescribed for the purpose under the CBCS as per the following:

#### MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY FOR APPEARANCE IN EXAMINATION

End semester external examination for B.A. /B.Sc./BBA/BPES course, under CBCS, shall be open to the following categories of students:

- 1. A Regular student i.e. a student who has undergone a regular course of study for the period specified for that course of study by having been on the rolls of the University immediately preceding the examination and has his/her name submitted to the Controller of Examinations by the Faculty/Campus where he/she has pursued the course for the examination and has fulfilled the following conditions to be certified by the Head/Dean/Co-Ordinator:
  - a) He/she has been a student of good conduct.
  - b) He/she has attended not less than 75% of the lecture delivered including seminars, tutorials etc. in each course opted by him/her in that semester.
  - c) In the case of laboratory course/practical, he/she has attended not less than 75% of the practical classes conducted (practical include field studies, workshop practice, map work, surveying etc.).
  - d) He/she has paid the prescribed fee.
- 2. Ex-students i.e. students who after having undergone a regular course of study and having completed all conditions of eligibility for appearance in a course(s) in a semester examination including minimum attendance requirement and having either failed to pass the semester examination in that subject/paper(s) or been unable to appear in the examination in that subject/paper(s) will be eligible to appear in the examination by submitting his/her application on the prescribed form along with prescribed fees to reach the Controller of Examinations within the dates fixed for this purpose. The reappearance in internal assessment is not permissible. The appearance in repeats and pass out repeats will be governed by the extant rules of CBCS.
