

# Report on Parent–Teacher Meeting

## Department of Electrical Engineering (Diploma – All Years)

A Parent–Teacher Meeting was successfully organized by the Department of Electrical Engineering for diploma students of all academic years on 25 Apr 2026. The purpose of the meeting was not merely to present academic records, but to create a space where performance could be understood, not just measured.

His interaction reflected a clear intent: to align expectations, not impose them. He emphasized both academic growth and behavioral development, reminding parents that education is shaped as much at home as it is in classrooms.

Some spoke with concern, others with quiet acceptance, but almost all carried the same underlying question: *Is the child becoming what the world demands, or what they truly are?* The dialogue allowed both sides to see the student not as a result, but as a process.

The coordination of the event was efficiently handled by **Mr. Lokesh Bhardwaj** and **Mr. Aviral Awasthi**, ensuring smooth communication between faculty, students, and parents throughout the session.

The meeting concluded on a thoughtful note—acknowledging that progress is not always visible in report cards. Sometimes, it exists in subtle shifts: a student asking one more question than before, or choosing effort over avoidance.

### **Outcome:**

The meeting strengthened the connection between parents and faculty, creating a shared responsibility toward the students' academic and personal development. It served as a reminder that education, when observed closely, is less about performance—and more about direction.
